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Additional Information and Estimated Timeline for Submitting Self-Study Reports

Multiple degree programs may be submitted in the same Self-Study Report if they share the learning opportunities and key assessments described in Part Two of the report. Once a complete Self-Study Report is submitted, the site visit and the Commission's accreditation decision typically occurs within a year.

NAEYC reserves the right to assign peer reviewers and to limit the number of site visits per cycle to preserve the quality of accreditation decisions. We will conduct site visits within one academic year after your completed report is received. Multiple degree programs or multiple campuses may require a longer site visit or larger review team.
