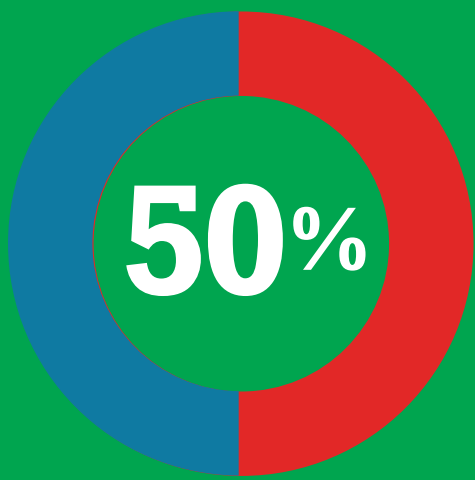


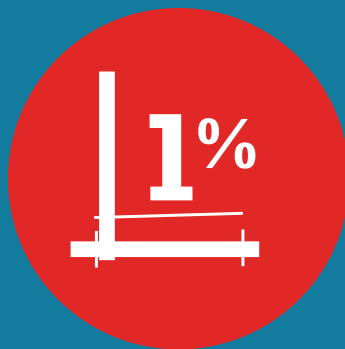
# Power to the Profession

The work of early childhood educators is valuable, complex – and chronically underfunded.

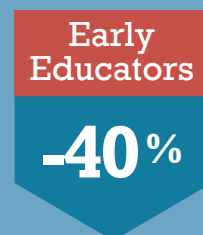


Fifty percent of early childhood educators are worried about their own family's economic well-being<sup>1</sup>
